The ZERO TO THREE Western Office is piloting the ***Prenatal to Age Five (P-5) Cross-Sector Core Competencies Training***. Cross-sector competency based training supports diverse early childhood professionals in coordinating and collaborating on behalf of young children and their families.

The P-5 Cross-Sector Core Competencies Training includes 8 online lessons, 4 virtual interactive Community of Practice sessions, Discussion Forums, and various opportunities to put knowledge into action through Optional Fieldwork.

The training is designed for:

- Learners with previous coursework or foundational training related to working with expectant families, young children from birth to age five, and their families
- Professionals working with expectant parents and/or children from birth to age five and their families in all levels of service including direct service providers, managers, supervisors, and program directors
- Professionals who work in a public or private organization in one of the following five service sectors:
 - Physical Health • Mental Health • Early Intervention and Early Identification
 - Child Welfare/Social Services • Early Care and Education
