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Updated Federal Poverty Level (FPL) Charts for BOTH Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) and Non-MAGI Healthcare programs are now available!

MAGI Medi-Cal

The MAGI FPL income guidelines have changed eligibility starting **January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018**. The eligibility with these new income numbers began **January 1, 2018**, but the **CalHEERS system did not get updated until April 1, 2018**. This means **there may be individuals who were screened and enrolled into the wrong program**.

Here's what you need to do to advocate for your clients:

- **For clients you assisted between January 1, 2018 and April 1, 2018:**
 1. **Review the eligibility results** for your clients who were **deemed INELIGIBLE for Medi-Cal or MCAP** and were denied coverage or were improperly enrolled in Covered California.
 2. **Next, determine whether or not your clients would actually be eligible for Medi-Cal** based on these new income guidelines and if they were improperly denied coverage.
 3. **To fix the improper denial of Medi-Cal or MCAP eligibility**, contact the county Medi-Cal office for them to process a redetermination for your client. To find your county contact info, please click [here](#).

*****PLEASE NOTE:** If a beneficiary enrolled in and paid the premium for a **Covered California plan** and was eligible to receive APTC, they will **NOT receive a refund for the premiums they paid**. Their **Medi-Cal benefits will start April 1st**, as long as they **contact their local county office ASAP** and **request a redetermination** of their Medi-Cal eligibility.***
